To help our partners best serve their communities, the SEAP offers technical assistance in a three-fold approach:





The Aim: Improve and support business acumen by restructuring, realigning, and repositioning resources including services and staff.

The Means: Evaluate internal processes to ensure cost efficiency.



The Aim: Create sustainable business models with marketing and financial expertise.

The Means: Identify local needs through market research and strengthen revenue models.



The Aim: Explore innovative ways our partners can enhance funding for immediate impact.

The Means: Seek donations, preferential loans and impact investing to enable our partners to scale up their social enterprises.



CASE STUDIES

Making a Difference in Honduras, Trinidad and Tobago, and Bolivia



COMMIT: Honduras

Community Health Promoter Network for Contraception Distribution

Context:

- Nearly one-half of recent births to women younger than 20 were unplanned.
- 45% of Hondurans live in rural areas, often with limited access to healthcare.

Response:

Strengthen the network of local health workers to provide basic reproductive health counselling and sell contraceptives and other products at reduced prices that are accessible to community members—while covering costs.

Objective:

Increase the capacity of our partner so they can manage a growing social enterprise network that is 100% self-sustaining.

Investment:

\$34,000 investment in a market research study designed to expand the products offered, strengthen the program's quality and increase volunteers' loyalty to the program.









CASE STUDIES

Making a Difference in Honduras, Trinidad and Tobago, and Bolivia



PREPARE: Trinidad and Tobago

Linking Populations to Accessible Healthcare



Context:

- 91% of the population lives in rural areas, many with little access to healthcare.
- There is an extreme disparity of wealth resulting in a lack of services for the country's most vulnerable populations.

Response:

Create a social enterprise that generates income by delivering sexual and reproductive health services in the workplace for for-profit companies. For each service sold to a company, our partner is able to deliver two health services to poor women and youth.

Objective:

- Increase services to vulnerable populations by 30% over two years.
- Generate \$23,000 in additional revenue to continue vital services.

Investment:

\$20,000 investment to build the business model **+ \$200,000** investment in mobile health unit to deliver services to clients.

LAUNCH: Bolivia

Sustainable Access to Clinical Services for Bolivian Migrant Populations



Context:

- Only 15% of 1 million Bolivian immigrants living in Argentina have health coverage.
- They experience high rates of pregnancy and high incidences of sexually transmitted infections and HIV.
- Due to social stigma and lack of access they are largely excluded from the Argentinian health sector.

Response:

Develop a self-sustaining healthcare center to serve at-risk Bolivians living in Buenos Aires. The center will generate revenue to subsidize 30,000 services by selling specialized products and health services.

Objective:

Reach high-need Bolivian migrants with critical services.

Investment:

\$25,000 in a market study and an additional **\$36,000** in a clinic. The clinic has the potential to generate \$500,000 in revenue in one year.

The Intersection of Social Justice and Sexual and Reproductive Health

IPPF/WHR has fostered life-changing and lifesaving—programs at the crossroad of social justice and sexual and reproductive health for more than 60 years. We have contributed to great achievements in the areas of family planning, access to contraception, and maternal mortality.

Despite these advances, enormous challenges remain.

Latin America has an extreme disparity of wealth, that influences political processes and starves public institutions of vital resources. Between this and the decline of international development assistance for sexual and reproductive health, the most vulnerable are left with few options.

Our goal with SEAP in Honduras is to expand the network of local volunteers who are trained to provide counselling and sell affordable contraceptives and other products to communities in need—while earning a profit to keep the network going.
